## Almond Crescent Cookies



I have been baking these since our first Christmas away from home and I look forward to doing so every year. For me it brings back nice memories baking with my Grandmother in Germany on Christmas Eve and this still is her recipe. Over the years it got translated into English, because so many friends asked for it, and a bit modernized. They still taste great.

2 cups sliced Almonds

1 1/4 all-purpose flour

1/4 cups sugar

1 cup butter, still cool but not hard

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 cup powdered sugar, optional

Measure 1 2/3 cups almonds. Whirl in food processor and grind fine. Finely chop the other 1/3 cups by hand and set aside. Add flour, sugar, butter and vanilla to food processor and pulse till dough comes together. Wrap in plastic and chill in fridge for about 1 hour. Roll dough into balls and form into crescents. Press top into chopped almonds and bake on parchment-lined cookie sheet on 350 degrees for 12 to 15 minutes until just lightly browned. Cool on sheet for 10 minutes and still warm roll in powdered sugar. Makes about 25 to 30 crescents.
